



General Scenario Logistics Information

We will be running 4 primary scenarios for the Berkeley Fire Ops. With 24 invited participants invited to the main event we should have 4 separate groups of 6 persons. Each scenario should last a maximum of 40 minutes, with a 10 minute break between rotations. Participants should be directed to the rehab tables for water breaks after each scenario. Groups will be identified by color tape on the participants arm.

Each group will have 1-2 persons assigned called “wranglers”. Wranglers perform a critical role—as leaders for the participants and the link between your elected officials and the messages to be communicated through Fire Ops 101. Wranglers need to know the key talking points for each scenario/stations well enough to reinforce them throughout the activities. They also need to know their group well enough to be aware of any special needs or concerns.

Wranglers function as an informal team-level safety officer. It is their role to work with the Incident Commander and the individual event coordinators to keep things running and on time. This includes making sure the group finishes each station at the correct time and moves to the rehab area.

- o Roof-top ventilation
- o *Wildland (secondary)*
- o *Water Rescue (secondary)*

The Secondary scenarios will be in place to take up the down time that participants will experience in between activities.
