## **Resolution No. 22**

## COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENT: Health & Safety Re: IAFF Medical Assistance Program

WHEREAS, the mission of the IAFF is to protect 1 2 and advocate for the health and well-being of our 3 members; and 4 WHEREAS, in 1986, the IAFF identified a need 5 to support our members'; health and well-being and 6 committed funds to enter a partnership with Johns 7 Hopkins University; and 8 WHEREAS, today's needs of our members have 9 exceeded the abilities of our current partnership with 10 Johns Hopkins University; and 11 WHEREAS, in 2022, the IAFF launched a pilot medical expert program to expand support to our 12 13 members with expert medical testimony drafted after 14 extensive research of available medical literature and 15 review of medical records, as well as medical and 16 legal consultations with members, their families, and 17 attorneys, leading to medical expert subject matter 18 testimony being presented during appeals, 19 subpoenas, depositions, trials and/or tribunals; and 20 WHEREAS, the pilot program is currently 21 overseen by the IAFF Chief Medical Officer, who 22 Presently serves in a triple role, also serving as 23 Assistant to the General President for the Division of Health, Safety, and Medicine, as well as the IAFF's 24 25 Medical Expert; and WHEREAS, this six-month pilot program was 26

27 originally slated to run from August 2022 to 28 February 2023, but, due to the overwhelming needs 29 identified in that timeframe, was extended to October 30 2023, and then extended again through the 57<sup>th</sup> 31 Convention: and 32 WHEREAS, when court decisions are 33 successfully overturned on appeal in favor of our members, their widows and/or orphans, it allows 34 them a dignified life, which eases financial worries 35 36 or struggles; and 37 WHEREAS, this program benefits not just 38 individual members, their widows, and/or orphans, 39 but the IAFF membership at large, given that the 40 extensive medical evidence researched and presented 41 for individual members is made available to local, 42 state, and provincial affiliates lobbying for the 43 expansion of presumptive legislation across all of the 44 U.S. and Canada; and 45 WHEREAS, the current capacity of the program 46 needs to be increased to properly meet the needs of 47 our members; and 48 WHEREAS, a reasonable and customary medical 49 expert rate is typically \$800 per hour; and 50 WHEREAS, an estimated 1,806 hours of staff 51 time has been spent on this pilot program as of the 52 end of May 2024, representing a total of \$1,444,800 53 saved for our members and their families; and 54 WHEREAS, this represents approximately only 55 one-third of the work on the current census in this 56 pilot; and 57 WHEREAS, upon the remaining two-thirds of

59	saved an estimated \$4,334,400 as of the end of May
60	2024; therefore be it
61	RESOLVED, That per capita be increased by 12
62	cents (\$0.12) to formally establish and fund the IAFF
63	Medical Assistance Program; and be it further
64	<b>RESOLVED</b> , That the General President ensures
65	the proper infrastructure is in place to adequately
66	staff the program; and be it further
67	<b>RESOLVED</b> , That the Medical Assistance
68	Program may seek additional assistance from other
69	physicians or subject matter experts to support the
70	program; and be it further
71	<b>RESOLVED</b> , That the IAFF Executive Board
72	establish and enact a policy(ies) to administer the
73	Medical Assistance Program and to set parameters
74	defining the level and the extent of the services
75	provided.
