## Resolution No. 25 COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENT: Health & Safety Re: Research on Pseudofolliculitis Barbae

WHEREAS, respiratory protection such as SCBA 1 2 are essential protective equipment for firefighters 3 saving lives and reducing the burdens of occupational 4 disease: and 5 WHEREAS, Occupational Safety and Health 6 Administration (OSHA) research and standards have 7 helped to greatly improve firefighter health and 8 safety; and 9 WHEREAS, current OSHA standards on facial 10 hair present concerns for employers and unions 11 trying to find reasonable accommodations for 12 firefighters with medical conditions such as 13 Pseudofolliculitis Barbae; and 14 WHEREAS, the inability to obtain reasonable 15 accommodations has been a threat to job security and 16 attempts to comply with grooming standards have 17 resulted in the hospitalization of members with 18 Pseudofolliculitis Barbae; and 19 WHEREAS, the VPFF, its affiliated locals and 20 the IAFF are the union for all firefighters regardless 21 of background; and 22 WHEREAS, our diversity and solidarity make our 23 union and the fire service strong; and 24 WHEREAS, SCBA technology continues to 25 improve potentially creating opportunities that did 26 not exist before; and

27	WHEREAS, no individual fire department or
28	local has the capacity on its own to undertake the
29	research necessary to amend OSHA standards; and
30	WHEREAS, the VPFF passed a resolution at its
31	convention in May 2024 to forward this issue to the
32	IAFF; therefore be it
33	RESOLVED, That the IAFF will work with
34	OSHA to undertake the research necessary to adjust
35	standards to allow for reasonable accommodations
36	for Pseudofolliculitis Barbae and related conditions;
37	and be it further
38	RESOLVED, That the IAFF will support said
39	entity in said research to the best of its ability.
