

As part of a mutual desire to help fire fighters and EMS personnel coping with cancer, the American Cancer Society (ACS), the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) and the IAFF Foundation are working together to fight cancer in the fire service. For fire fighters and emergency medical personnel, occupational cancer deaths have surpassed all other line-of-duty deaths to become the leading cause of death.

This collaboration includes making cancer resources more readily available through access to occupational cancer prevention programs and patient support programs to ensure that fire fighters and EMS personnel have the information, resources and support needed to help prevent and treat occupational cancer.
