Preparedness

- Organizational SOPs
- Recognition of Heat/Cold Stress
- Member Prehabilitation
 - Proper hydration, nutrition, rest
 - Fitness



Contamination Control

- Hazard Control Zones
- Contamination Reduction
 - Preliminary Exposure Reduction (PER)
 - IAW NFPA 1851
- On-Scene Personal Hygiene



Incident Scene and Training Rehabilitation

- Heat and Cold Stress
- Hydration/Nutrition
- Rest & Recovery
- Assessment of Vital Signs
 - No longer indiscriminate vital signs checks
 - "EMS personnel shall evaluate members with symptoms suggestive of a health and/or safety concern."



Post-Incident Recovery

- Demobilization process
- Post-incident personal hygiene
- Cleaning and decontamination of apparatus, protective clothing, and equipment
- Identification of Potentially Traumatic Events
- Exposure Reporting
