EMS Programs and Services





The IAFF is dedicated to improving the lives and careers of our EMS members. With more than 316,000 members across the United States and Canada, the IAFF supports EMS providers in part by participating in payment reform and advocating for EMS legislation at the federal, state, provincial and local levels.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

The IAFF leads the way in the development and implementation of health and safety programs, including:

Wellness-Fitness Initiative — An educational, non-punitive approach to wellness and fitness programs in the fire service.

Peer Support Program — Peer counseling to help reduce stigma, build resiliency and create awareness of post-traumatic stress and other behavioral health issues. The IAFF has trained more than 3,500 peer support counselors to respond when tragedy strikes.

Equipment — We fight to make sure that members have the best equipment and protections to keep them safe, including protective equipment and immunizations against exposure to infectious diseases and influenza.

FIRE AND EMS SERVICES

The IAFF provides system response and deployment analysis, EMS integration and enhancement, and system development and design for fire and EMS response. Additionally, the IAFF is directly involved in initiatives that affect pre- and post-hospital care.

The IAFF Standing Committee on EMS provides advice and guidance on all aspects of the IAFF's work in preand out-of-hospital care. The 16-member (one for each district) committee stays up to date on current threats and opportunities within the EMS industry to better provide for our members.

The IAFF provides subject matter expertise regarding EMS-related legislative issues considered on Capitol Hill.

IAFF CENTER OF EXCELLENCE FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH TREATMENT AND RECOVERY

The IAFF Center of Excellence is exclusively for IAFF members with post-traumatic stress, substance abuse, addiction, depression and other behavioral health issues. Located outside Washington, DC, the Center provides treatment to help members return to the life and job they love.



SUPPORT AND ADVOCACY FOR EMS

The IAFF participates in national-level EMS stakeholder meetings hosted by various federal agencies, including the Emergency Care Coordination Center in the Office of Preparedness and Emergency Operations and the Division of Health Systems and Health Care Policy in the Office of Policy and Planning — both under the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) — as well as special issue sessions organized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

The IAFF also participates in National EMS Advisory Council (NEMSAC) and Federal Interagency Committee on Emergency Medical Services (FICEMS) meetings.

Additionally, the IAFF holds two seats on the Committee on Accreditation of EMS Education Programs (CoAEMSP).

The IAFF also has representatives on all National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards committees and supports efforts to develop both fire and EMS staffing, deployment and performance objectives published in NFPA Standard 1710 and continues to enhance public safety.
