

L.C. Merrell, 43, veteran firefighter

Lt. L.C. Merrell was not only a top Chicago firefighter but also part of the community outside the firehouse, whether it was looking after a stray dog or taking someone interested in firefighting under his wing.

"He started teaching me what being a firefighter was like," said Edward Lee, 16, who had known Mr. Merrell for about a year after dropping in at the fire station one day.

Mr. Merrell, 43, was killed Saturday when his fire truck was hit by a landscaping truck at 107th Street and Throop.

Mr. Merrell, a father of five, had the confidence of the firefighters he led because they knew he would make the right calls on the scene, his colleagues recalled.

His concern extended to a sick stray dog he saw wandering outside the fire station one day, Lee said. Mr. Merrell took the dog in, fed it and made sure it was cared for.
