Christopher Brian Hunton, 27, of Amarillo died Monday, April 25, 2005.

Celebration of life services will be at 4 p. m. Thursday in First Baptist Church of Lubbock. Burial will be in Resthaven Memorial Park by Rix Funeral Directors of Lubbock.

Mr. Hunton died after suffering an accident in the line of duty. He was born July 8, 1977, in Lubbock to Janet and Paul Hunton. He graduated from Lubbock Cooper High School in 1995 and attended South Plains College and Texas Tech University. He found his vocational love in firefighting and graduated from Amarillo College's Fire Fighting School. For two years before he was hired by the Amarillo Fire Department, Brian volunteered his time at the Randall County Volunteer Department where he continued to volunteer after his hiring.

During his two years as a firefighter, Brian attended multiple classes at National Fire Academy in Maryland, Weapons of Mass Destruction Hazardous Materials Technology and Chemicals in Alabama and National Emergency Incident Management System at Texas A&M. Brian's interest in public service began in high school when a granddaughter of a friend needed blood. Ever since that time, Brian was a regular blood donor.
