COVID-19: In-Person Events Guidance

The IAFF strongly recommends all attendees be fully vaccinated (14 days post-injection of final shot in a series or one shot of Johnson & Johnson vaccine) to reduce the risk of COVID-19. As restrictions relax, updated steps to ensure in-person events are held safely and responsibly include:

1. Review State, Local and Provincial Reopening Plans:

- For IAFF U.S. events only:
 - For each request and before contract approval the applicable IAFF program coordinator must review the New York Times reopening map with event point of contact(s) to identify specific local capacity restrictions and mask mandates.
 - Local restrictions may differ at the state level. Review local health department guidance to comply with event capacity restrictions and mask mandates.
 - The New York Times map should be reviewed with event point of contact(s) and the IAFF 30 days prior to event to identify any needed changes.
- Until further notice, all IAFF Canadian events will remain 100% virtual.

2. If event can be held, follow Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance:

- Event organizers can ask if attendees are vaccinated but cannot ask for proof or vaccine cards.
 - If attendees or IAFF staff/instructors are vaccinated:
 - They do not have to wear a mask. Vaccinated individuals may continue to wear a mask if they feel more comfortable wearing one.
 - If attendees or IAFF staff/instructors are NOT vaccinated:
 - These individuals should continue to wear a mask and social distance for the event.
 - Signage in the event venue should reflect mask usage and social distancing guidance for vaccinated and unvaccinated attendees.

3. Travel Guidance

- Fully Vaccinated:
 - Follow all travel recommendations, including wearing a mask while traveling and self-monitor for signs and symptoms. You do NOT need to get tested or self-quarantine if you are fully vaccinated or have recovered from COVID-19 in the past 90 days.
- Unvaccinated or Not Fully Vaccinated:
 - During Travel: wear a mask, social distance and practice preventive measures.
 - Post travel: Get tested with a RT-PCR test three to five days after travel AND stay home/self-quarantine for a full seven days after travel. Even if you test negative, stay home and self-quarantine for the full seven days. If you do not get tested, stay home and self-quarantine for 10 days after travel.

4. Additional concerns for attendees and IAFF staff/instructors:

- Regardless of whether an individual is vaccinated or unvaccinated, if they have any COVID-19 related signs and symptoms, they
 SHOULD NOT ATTEND THE EVENT.
- Signs and symptoms include:
 - · Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatique

- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat

In registering for this event, you will be asked to provide information about whether you are vaccinated against COVID-19. The IAFF will maintain this information confidentially and will only disclose this information as required by law. By registering for this event, you agree that we may disclose your COVID-19 vaccination status as needed to comply with applicable law, including local COVID-19 orders.
