

NFORS Exposure Tracking Has Gone Mobile!

The new National Fire Operations
Reporting System (NFORS)
exposure tracking module is
now available as an app from
the Google Play store and the
Apple App store. With the
mobile app, any fire fighter,
paramedic or officer can access
and use the exposure tracker
which serves as a personal
database providing a detailed
history of work and
exposures in a private,
encrypted and secure online
environment.

Benefits of the mobile Exposure Tracker:

- Documents both physical and behavioral health exposures throughout your career
- Document exposures on-the-go from anywhere
- Your data stays with you even into retirement
- Track all of your incidents throughout your career with live NFORS CAD integrations in your department
- Be part of National Firefighter Cancer studies by opting-in to share your exposure data with researchers



How to Get Started

Download the app and complete your NFORS individual profile. This profile will be yours alone. The data you enter will be

encrypted and secure. The department will not have access to your data. If your department participates in NFORS CAD, the department will receive periodic aggregate reports about overall exposure trends — <u>not</u> individual reports.

Upon the completion of your profile, you will be assigned a unique NFORS ID Code Number that will remain your NFORS ID for life. You will keep your NFORS account and all your data

even if you leave the department or retire

Department Participation

Encourage your department to participate in this nationwide program to ensure that you have information about your on-the-job exposures readily available should you ever need it and as part of the ongoing firefighter cancer surveillance research to stop the proliferation of this deadly disease in our ranks. By linking your department to NFORS, your incident data will automatically load directly into your personal exposure record.

"NFORS is also a personal database providing a detailed history of your work and exposures in a private, encrypted, secure online environment, all available on a mobile device. The NFORS Exposure App becomes a fire fighter career diary to ensure evidence of career exposures, should physical or behavioral health issues arise long-term or even in retirement."

Download the Mobile App

Visit the Apple App store or Google Play and search "NFORS". Download the app to your personal phone and complete your profile. It's that simple! Go to the app store and search for NFORS Exposure App. The app works on iOS and Android.

DISASTER EXPOSURE TRACKING

To enter an exposure, click the + sign or exposure button. Enter the incident number and address or the deployment location where you are working. Select the Fire, HazMat, EMS or Rescue Module as appropriate for the situation. Toxic water and similar exposures are in the HazMat Module. Complete your report and SAVE to your Career Diary.
